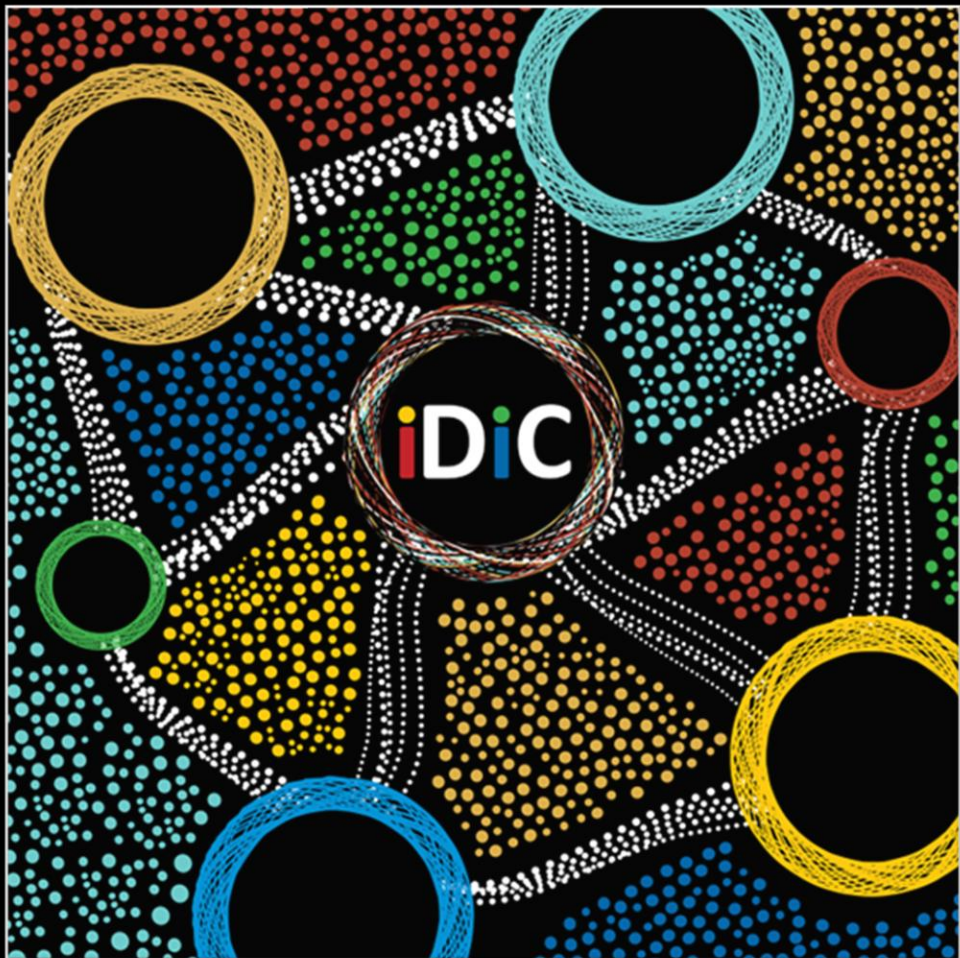

iDiC operates as a supply chain aggregator and delivery partner, providing:

- A single-entry point to a national Indigenous business network
- End-to-end management of engagement, onboarding, and delivery

Opportunities are subcontracted through iDiC to one or more consortium partners, ensuring the right capability is matched to each project.

This model simplifies access to Indigenous supply chains, reduces administrative complexity, and ensures capability alignment, while accelerating Indigenous supplier participation and outcomes.

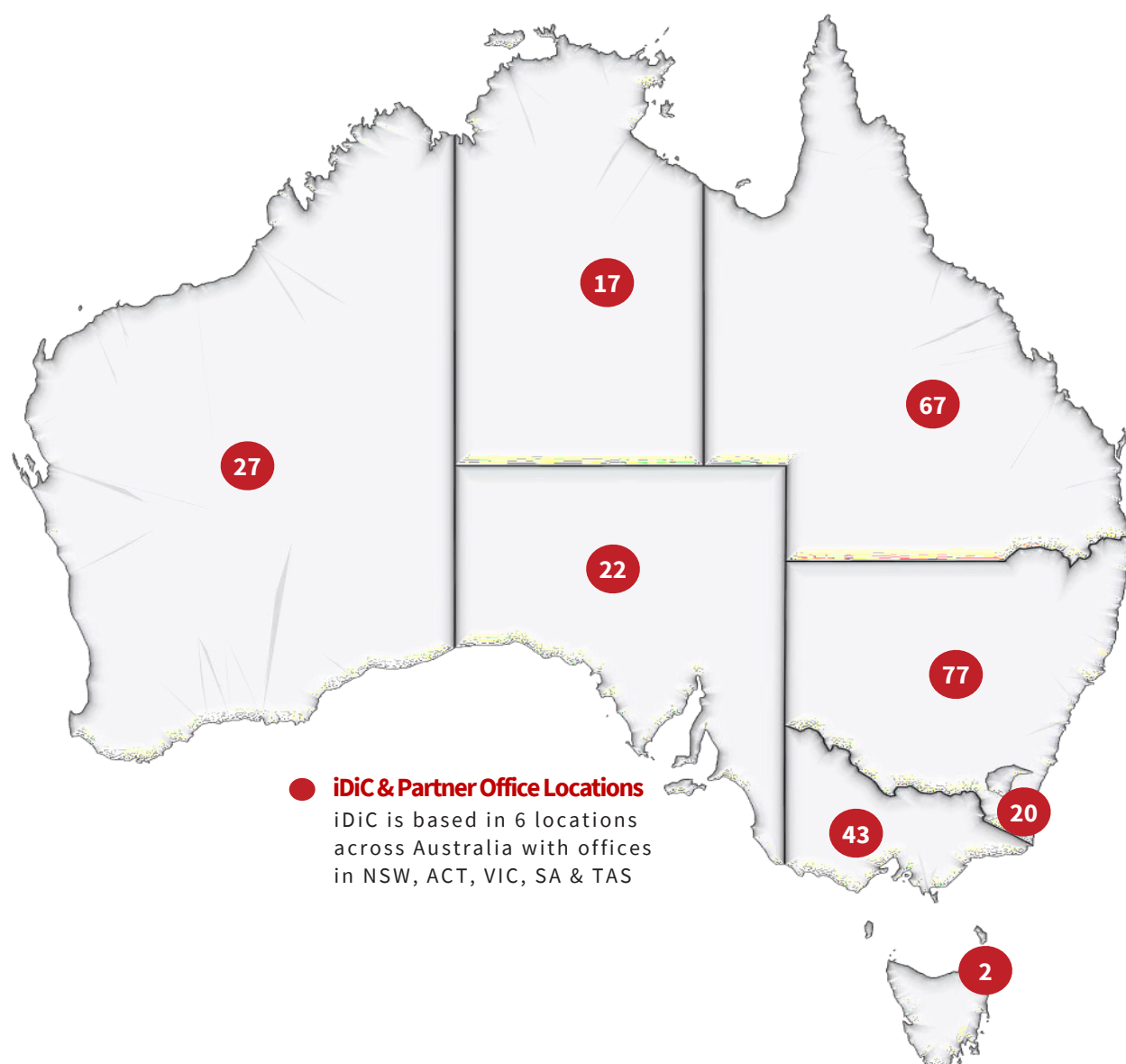

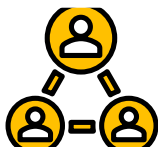

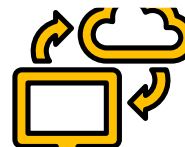
